

Market Towns Parking Review Moreton-In-Marsh Draft Proposal

Overview of Initial Proposals

An overview of the proposed parking restrictions are shown on the map opposite. The locations highlighted on the map show where parking would be allowed, whether by pay and display, time-limited (free) or with permit.
All other lengths of road within the zone would be subject to yellow lines (No Waiting restrictions).

On-Street Parking Restrictions

- █ **Permit Holders Only**
Only vehicles with a valid resident permit or visitor voucher can park.
- █ **Permit Holders or Pay & Display Maximum Stay 2hrs**
Non-permit holders can park for up to 2 hours and will be required to pay a charge. Permit Holders and vehicles with a valid visitor voucher can park, and are exempt from the time limit.
- █ **Permit Holders or Pay & Display Maximum Stay 4hrs**
Non-permit holders can park for up to 4 hours and will be required to pay a charge. Permit Holders and vehicles with a valid visitor voucher can park and are exempt from the time limit.
- █ **Permit Holders or 4 Hours Free Parking**
Non-permit holders can park for up to 4 hours free of charge. Permit Holders and vehicles with a valid visitor voucher can park and are exempt from the time limit.
- █ **Pay & Display Only Maximum Stay 2hrs**
Any vehicle, with or without a permit or voucher, can park for up to 2 hours and will be required to pay a charge.
- █ **Permit Holders or 6 Hours Free Parking**
Non-permit holders can park for up to 6 hours free of charge. Permit Holders and vehicles with a valid visitor voucher can park and are exempt from the time limit.

'Non-permit holder' refers to ANY vehicle without a parking permit or a valid visitor voucher.

NOTE: THESE PROPOSALS APPLY TO ON-STREET PARKING. OTHER RESTRICTIONS WOULD APPLY IN THE CAR PARKS, INCLUDING THE HIGH STREET CAR PARK.

Permit Parking Zone Moreton-In-Marsh

- Properties inside the Zone are eligible to buy permits which allow them to park in any of the permit parking spaces allocated to that Zone.

When should these restrictions apply?
We suggest 10am-6pm, seven days a week.
Different operating times and days will be considered based on the feedback we receive.
